

The world is filled with a wide variety of flowers, but one of 13 23 the most amazing flowers of all is the sunflower. Sunflowers 32 are easily recognizable thanks to their extremely tall height, 42 their bright petals, and large dark middles. Sunflowers not only 56 look like the sun; they need a great deal of it to flourish! They thrive with 6-8 hours a day of sunlight. Sunflowers can 66 76 typically grow up to sixteen feet tall, although the tallest sunflower ever recorded reach a height of 30 feet and one 87 inch. The dark middle of the sunflower is called the head. The qq head is covered by tiny flowers called florets. Each floret will 120 produce a seed. Sunflower seeds are useful for many reasons. First, they produce more sunflowers. Secondly, they provide 128 140 food for birds. Many people like to snack on sunflower seeds as 151 well! Did you know that sunflower seeds can also be processed 161 into cooking oil? Sunflowers are not only beautiful; they are 167 useful as well. Sunflowers are spectacular!





All About the Desert

12 The world is filled with five unique biomes. These biomes are all 21 very different from each other. They have different climates, 29 different weather, different plant life, and different animals 38 inhabiting them. The five major biomes are: aquatic, grassland, 49 desert, tundra, and forest. Of these biomes, the desert is the driest. A desert is defined as a place where very little 60 69 precipitation falls, and there is very little vegetation. Many 81 people do not realize that there are both hot and cold deserts. 92 The largest desert in the world is Antarctica. The largest hot desert is the Sahara Desert in Africa. Although it is very hot 104 116 during the day, it becomes quite chilly when the sun goes down! 128 Plants that live in the desert must be specialized so that they can survive on very little rain. They may have methods for 139 148 storing water, or they may have extensive root systems. Animals too must have special features to allow them to survive 159 170 in these extreme conditions. The desert is a unique biome, filled 175 with interesting plants and animals!

How a Teddy Bear is Made

Date

Teddy bears come in countless shapes, sizes, colors, and q 19 materials. Have you ever stopped to wonder how a teddy 31 bear is made? Making a teddy bear is a very involved process 42 that requires many more steps than you may think. The first 53 thing a teddy bear manufacturer needs to do to create a 67 plush bear is to select the type of fur they will use. Then the 79 fur is stacked into layers. Machines are used to cut the fur 99 into many pieces that will eventually be sewn together to qq create the finished product. After the pieces are cut, they ||are sewn either by hand or by machine. The smallest pieces 121 are sewn together first, and then are attached to the head 133 and body. A worker then creates a face for the bear. Next, the bear is sent off to be stuffed. The bear is then sewn 146 157 completely shut and other details, such as a ribbon, are added. 168 Lastly, the fur is groomed so that the bear looks presentable 173 and for its new home.


